The primary users of an ADA beach access ramp will not be in wheelchairs.





Just the facts: USA Wheelchair User Statistics

- 20% of women and 17% of men with disabilities use wheelchairs
- 11.6 Million disabled using cane, crutches and walkers
- 2 million = the amount of wheelchair users added every year
